It is very important that students be working in both Acellus and iready everyday. The kindergarten students are learning a lot. All your efforts to log them into our live sessions and working with them are greatly appreciated. Please continue to practice letter sounds, sight words, and math facts with your child. The students have learned all the alphabets sounds and are sounding out many words. This is a skill that can be practiced and strengthened at home. Your efforts will help them to become successful readers. In math, the students will continue to work with numbers by counting, adding, and finding missing numbers. #### 3rd-5th Grade

It's hard to believe it's already February! This month, third grade students will be comparing different types of text in ELA. In math, third grade is working on fractions, and in science they are finishing up a water unit and starting atmosphere. In fourth grade math, students will be finishing fractions, working on line plots, and division. Fourth graders will be summarizing and identifying figurative language in ELA. In Science, they will be learning about the transfer of energy. In fifth grade, students will be moving on to opinion writing and book reviews. In social studies, fifth graders will be learning about inventions and inventors, and delving deeper into fractions in math. Please have your student read and practice their multiplication facts!

**1st-2nd Grade** This month in math, first grade students will work with patterns and begin telling time to the hour and half hour. They will focus on space explorations in Science. First graders will plan and write an explanatory paragraph. In math, second graders are learning about fractions and how to count money. The second graders will be learning about cycles in nature and writing a persuasive letter. Reading is still a big focus area in both first and second grade. Students are working on strategies to read faster and more fluently. Please remember that the goal for first grade students is to read about 70 words per minute before moving on to 2nd grade. Second grade students need to be reading 111 words per minute before moving on to 3rd grade.

Middle School Greetings students and families, Upon our return from Winter Break, our students have gotten into a routine for learning online. We are half-way through the second quarter and it is a busy time. Galileo testing will be the last week of this month, followed immediately by Parent Teacher conferences starting March 1<sup>st</sup>. These conferences will be to follow up on the strategies we put in place in December to help the students succeed, like tutoring and check-ins. We know it has been and continues to be a difficult time; we appreciate your support very much.
