In reading, they will continue to learn all the letter sounds as well as continue to learn and practice many sight words. They will begin to read in decodable books. I encourage you to continue reading with your child each night. Read! Read! Read! In math, the students will focus on addition, subtraction, comparing sets and story problems through the end of the year.

**1st & 2nd Grade** What a whirlwind time it has been returning to the classroom! There are still many things to do to finish out another great year. Thanks for encouraging and supporting our students at home as well as at school. Some first graders have already met the year-end goal of reading 69 words per minute and many other are on their way to that goal. The class will spend a lot of time learning and practicing sight words as they are a big part of the reading process. First grade students are focusing on subtraction and second grade is working on addition and subtraction with two-and three-digit numbers.

**3rd, 4th & 5th Grade** -Yeah! It's so good to see everyone back in person! April is here and so is state standardized testing. Although testing will look different this year, third, fourth, and fifth grade will take the computer-based AzM2 tests in reading, writing, and math. To help get them through this rigorous testing schedule, please make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats healthy meals.

All students must be at school on time each and every day of the AzM2 testing period.

Please have your child at school by 7:30am
