February provides a wonderful opportunity for students, their families, and friends to celebrate the dramatic arts at the Guild of the Vale. It is hard to believe that the 2022-23 school year is at the halfway point! Our first grade class is moving right along with the reading program. Please watch for and practice throughout the week the "lightning words", the reading passage and the spelling words that are sent home each Monday. Thank you for your support in helping your child strengthen their reading skills. In math, the students are working hard to understand place values of ones, tens and hundreds as well as learning different strategies to find missing addends.

Happy New Year 2nd grade families! Students were so happy to be back to school and they have been going strong in 2023 so far! In Math, we will continue our learning in regrouping with addition up to the number 999. We will do lots of practice with manipulatives, whiteboards, and paper/pencil. A big THANK YOU to everyone who is supporting your student in reading every night. I really does help them. Students should read for 15 minutes at least Monday - Thursday. Our goal by the end of the year is to read at least 80 words per minute. We will continue working on fluency and comprehending skills in reading.

3rd-5th grade Mr. Rendon, Ms. Adams & Mrs. Koperno

It's hard to believe it is already February! The third grade class will be finishing up a unit on area and begin fractions for math. During our reading block our class will be comparing points of view while continuing to focus on sequencing and compare/contrast. Students will continue honing their writing skills while planning and writing their argumentative essays.

In fourth grade, we are finishing up our "All About Me" posters and starting our Cats vs. Dogs essays. In math we are finishing up multiplication factors and multiples and will be moving on to division. For science, we are learning about different types of volcanoes.

In fifth grade, students will continue working on place values with decimals. We will learn how decimals and fractions are related, including multiplication and division of decimals and fractions. In science, they will begin an Earth and Space unit. Please continue to read and practice math facts at home!

How the Arizona Tax Credit Works

When you file your Arizona taxes, you can claim a dollar-for-dollar Arizona Charitable Tax Credit that will either reduce your tax liability or increase your refund.

2 Ways 2 Give

- 1. Qualifying Charitable Organization Tax Credit, single filers maximum gift \$400 and married filers up to \$800. Boys & Girls Clubs of the Valley, Arizona State QCO Code: 20331 on AZDOR Form 321
- 2. Public School Tax Credit, single filers maximum gift \$200 and married filers up to \$400. Mesa Arts Academy, School Tax Credit TDS Code: 078613101 on AZDOR Form 322

FOR EXAMPLE:

If a couple owes a \$1,000 in state income tax, and donates \$800, they may subtract the \$800 from their tax bill and pay the state only \$200.

If they owe NOTHING in Arizona state income taxes, and donate \$800, they will get a refund of at least \$800 back from the state — what a great way to give to BGCAZ AND get money back, dollar for dollar!

GREAT NEWS!

The Tax Credit is available to you even if you do not itemize your deductions on your taxes. And you can take advantage of BOTH tax credits.

If you make your direct contribution to Boys & Girls Clubs of the Valley, or Mesa Arts Academy, it must be received prior to your tax filing.






