Third grade will be working on multiplication and division in math and text features/kinds of text in ELA. Fourth grade is finishing multiplication and division and starting fractions in math, reading dramas in ELA, and learning about weather and the water cycle in science. Fifth grade is moving on to dividing with double digits in math and in ELA, they will be discussing character traits and supporting evdence. Students will also begin narrative writing and exploring ecosystems in science.

In ELA, 3rd, 4th, and 5th will be working on writing an opinion essay, and discussing character traits and how they effect the story. We are also learning how to summarize a story.




# The Mesa Arts Academy Dragons would like to welcome the MAAPO Leadership Team!!
