#### 1st Grade Mrs. Nahil

In first grade, our students have been actively engaged in strengthening their phonics skills through the study of vowel teams, including ai, ay, ee, ea, ew, and ie. These phonics patterns have been purposefully integrated into both reading and writing activities to support comprehensive literacy development. We are pleased to share that our students have demonstrated commendable progress in their reading journey. Through the SAM reading program, they have collectively read an impressive total of 50,021 words independently.

In mathematics, instruction has focused on reinforcing foundational number sense and fact fluency through a variety of addition and subtraction strategies. These include understanding inverse relationships, counting on, utilizing visual representations such as ten frames and pictures, working with manipulatives, and applying number lines.

In science, our current unit explores the life cycles of various plants and animals, fostering curiosity and a deeper understanding of the natural world.

We want to thank you parents for your continued support in your child's learning journey.

## 2nd Grade Mrs.Jackson

Second grade have been making great progress in their reading! Thank you for your support at home. It is making a great difference! Students will continue studying fables and main idea. In science, our 3rd graders are studying Life Cycles, comparing how plants and animals grow and change through the stages of birth, growth, reproduction, and death, and exploring how understanding life cycles can help solve problems in an environment. In 4th grade, students are investigating Earth's Surface Processes, exploring fast changes like volcanic eruptions and slow changes such as weathering and erosion, then designing solutions to reduce their impact on humans. In 5th grade, students are learning about Ecosystems, building models of food chains and food webs to see how matter and energy move between consumers, producers, and decomposers, and discussing how we can protect these environments. In social studies, 5th graders will also be focusing on Respect through the Kindness in the Classroom curriculum to build a more caring and responsible community.
