#### 1st Grade Mrs. Ismail

In first grade, our students have been hard at work, strengthening their phonics skills. This month, we focused on vowel teams such as oo, oe, oa, igh, ie, and ew. These phonics patterns were purposefully integrated into both reading and writing activities to promote strong, well-rounded literacy development.

We are also excited to celebrate the impressive progress our young readers have made. Through the SAM reading program, students have independently read a remarkable 97,786 words so far!

In mathematics, instruction has emphasized developing a solid understanding of addition and subtraction through inverse relationships and fact families. Students have practiced these concepts using visual supports like ten frames and pictures, hands-on manipulatives, and number lines. First graders have also begun learning how to read a clock—an important new skill.

In science, students explored the changing seasons and learned about various types of animals, inspiring curiosity and deepening their understanding of the natural world.

We sincerely thank all parents for your continued support in your child's learning journey. Your partnership makes a meaningful difference every day.



As we finish up the first half of the 2025–2026 school year, it is a great time to reflect on the many accomplishments in second grade. Your students have learned many new sight words, they have been decoding words and working hard on their fluency skills and goals. We will continue to strengthen and build on these reading skills.



Happy Winte! 3rd, 4th, and 5th are working hard leading up to our Thanksgiving and Winter breaks! In Math, 3rd graders are continuing to work on their Division skills. 4th grade Math is beginning their Unit on Fractions, and 5th graders in Math are continuing their unit on Fractions. In English Language Arts, 3rd, 4th, and 5th, are working on citing information from an article and editing their writing as well as recognizing informational texts.

In science, our 3rd graders are studying Inherited and Acquired Traits, exploring how plants and animals receive traits from their parents, and how environments can influence those traits. They are also learning how traits vary across organisms and how natural and artificial selection can cause traits to change over time. Our 4th graders are investigating the Science of Sound, building devices to feel vibrations and using digital tools to visualize sound waves that help us understand how we hear different things. In 5th grade science, students are exploring the Water Cycle and Earth's Systems, examining how water is distributed on Earth, how it moves through the hydrosphere and atmosphere, and how water impacts human societies. Students will also design solutions to help reduce the effects of weather-related natural hazards.

In social studies, 5th graders are working through the Kindness in the Classroom curriculum, which teaches kindness skills through the steps of Inspire, Empower, Act, Reflect, and Share. Each lesson begins by revisiting prior learning, and students apply kindness strategies through hands-on projects and classroom actions.

Our construction and site preparation work continues to move forward with steady progress. Here are the latest updates from the team:

### **Demolition Permit**

We have officially received our demolition permit. Final paperwork is undergoing a 10-day review period, during which demolition cannot occur. This means demolition of the existing buildings may begin as early as Monday, December 1, following the conclusion of the required hold. No additional delays are expected, as this is a routine compliance step.

## Work Happening Before Demolition

Contractors are actively preparing the site. Construction Superintendent James Pearson is coordinating the plumbing and electrical disconnections, as well as other pre-demo work. Crews are also working on the rear pathway—covering the trench, stabilizing the area, and completing fencing—so the site remains safe throughout the process.

## Thanksgiving Week Site Work

During the short Thanksgiving week (with no school on Wednesday), the construction team reconfigured the parking lot. They will be working on improving access to the back of the portables. This includes regrading, laying stone, and placing a protective plate over the concrete.

When students and staff return from the Thanksgiving break, they can expect to see the new parking layout and improved access routes already in place.

We appreciate your patience and support as we continue making progress toward our improved campus. More updates will follow as we move into the demolition phase and beyond.




